"Fake news is a term that refers to news outlets that pretend to be real but are actually fake. Fake news includes false stories about all sorts of topics that are crafted in order to appear real and get traffic and social shares on Facebook and Twitter." -Slangit

Metro Manila (CNN Philippines, October 10) — Senator Cynthia Villar hit the Department of Agriculture for allocating a big chunk of its proposed 2020 budget on research for the National Corn Program instead of offering direct assistance to farmers.

The chairman of the Senate agriculture, food, and agrarian reform committee on Wednesday slammed DA's decision to allocate ₱150 million of the ₱1.2 billion proposed budget to research for the corn program.

"Bakit parang lahat ng inyong budget puro research? Baliw na baliw kayo sa research. Aanhin ninyo ba 'yung research? Ako, matalino akong tao, pero hindi ko maintindihan 'yang research niyo, lalo na 'yung farmer. Gusto ba ng farmer ang research? Hindi ba gusto nila tulungan niyo sila?" she said during the budget hearing.

She also interrogated DA officials on why the proposed reserve fund for the National Corn Program is higher than the allocation for seedling distribution. Under the proposed 2020 budget, the budget for seed reserve is \$218 million, while the distribution is at \$31 million. The reserve will be provided to farmers during calamities.

Agriculture Undersecretary Ariel Cayanan explained five percent of production should be set aside as buffer stock. He said they also give assistance to farmers in the form of seeds and fertilizers.

However, Villar said farmers need more direct assistance. She asked the department to revise its proposed budget.

"Kung ako farmer gusto ko na bigyan ako ng seeds, bigyan ako ng machinery, kaysa 'yung mga kung anu-anong 'yan. Kaunting-kaunti lang ang ibinibigay sa farmers kaya ang ating mga farmers continously naghihirap," she said.

Villar: 'I am not against research'

MANILA - Senator Cynthia Villar on Wednesday clarified that she was "not against research" after drawing flak over the weekend for criticizing the Department of Agriculture's (DA) budget on corn study.

Villar, who chairs the Senate Committee on Agriculture and Food, earlier slammed the DA for earmarking P150 million for the National Corn Program's research.

'Puro research': Villar hits agriculture budget on corn program

"I am not against research [pero] hindi naman puwedeng puro research, walang application of the research," Villar said in a press conference in Quezon City.

"I want a research that could be applied," she said.

The National Dairy Authority and the Philippine Carabao Center have been conducting research for 26 years, but dairy production in the country remains at 1 percent of demand, Villar said.

The Philippine Rice Research Institute (PhilRice) discovered an inbred seed that could increase harvest by 50 percent, but had to wait for additional funding before distributing the technology to farmers, she said.




What is post truth?

What is false claim?

Any remark or statement made by a public figure or government agency that contradicts official documents and figures, national and international laws, and/or scientific studies.



676,000 internet users aged 16-64 were interviewed across 46 markets. Source: Global Web Index via DataReportal















Consider the Source





Check the date

Some false stories aren't completely fake, but rather distortions of real events.



Is this some kind of joke?

Remember, there is such a thing as satire. Normally, it's clearly labeled as such, and sometimes it's even funny





HOW TO SPOT FAKE NEWS



CONSIDER THE SOURCE

Click away from the story to investigate the site, its mission and its contact info.



CHECK THE AUTHOR

Do a quick search on the author. Are they credible? Are they real?



CHECK THE DATE

Reposting old news stories doesn't mean they're relevant to current events,



CHECK YOUR BIASES

Consider if your own beliefs could affect your judgement.



READ BEYOND

Headlines can be outrageous in an effort to get clicks. What's the whole story?



SUPPORTING SOURCES?

Click on those links. Determine if the info given actually supports the story.



IS IT A JOKE?

If it is too outlandish, it might be satire. Research the site and author to be sure.



ASK THE EXPERTS

Ask a librarian, or consult a fact-checking site.
