FAQS (Frequently Asked Questions)

Who is in charge of the voting process in the precinct?

Each precinct/cluster precinct has an Electoral Board (EB) in charge of facilitating the election day proceedings.

Who can vote?

Newly-registered voters and existing voters who were able to cast their ballots in the last two elections, will be allowed to vote.

Can I bring a kodigo inside the voting area?

Yes. To save time, voters are encouraged to bring a sheet of paper with a list of their selected candidates.

When will the National and Local Elections be held?

May 9, 2022 (Monday)

Can I bring my cellphone inside the voting area?

Yes, cellular phones are allowed inside the voting area, but voters are not allowed to use them at any time.

Will anyone be there to assist persons with disabilities (PWDs)?

Electoral Boards may give assistance to PWDs, senior citizens, and illiterate voters. Relatives of persons with disabilities are also allowed to aid them in voting.

What time will voting precincts be open?

Precincts will be open from 6AM to 6PM. Voters are advised to come to the polling areas early. Each precinct may serve up to 1000 voters.

Are candidates still allowed to campaign on election day?

No. As Comelec rules state, it is "unlawful" for candidates to campaign both on the eve of election day and on the day itself.

How many candidates am I supposed to vote for?

National Positions:

- 1 President
- 1 Vice President
- 12 Senators
- 1 Partylist Group

Local Positions:

- 1 Congressman
- 1 Mayor
- 1 Vice Mayor
- Alloted number of councilors per locality
- 1 Governor
- 1 Vice Governor

Note: You can vote for fewer candidates whose position require more than 1 candidate but you cannot overvote.

What do I do if my name is not on the voters' list?

You may ask for assistance from the desks of the accredited citizen's arm of the Comelec in the elections (e.g. PPCRV).

How do I find my assigned precinct?

Check the Comelec website's Precinct Finder. The Comelec also encourages registered voters to confirm their status and precincts with their respective local offices.

Is it necessary to have my voter's ID on election day?

No, a voter's ID is not required. You may present any valid ID such as a passport, driver's license, or any other government-issued ID. For students, a valid school ID will do.

Can I get another ballot if I fill one out wrong?

No. Only one ballot is allowed for each voter.

What if I don't have any ID with me?

The list of voters with the EB will have photos and other details derived from the biometrics record.

What is the proper way of shading the ballot?

It is encouraged that you fill the circles completely for the VCM to read it better. Check or X marks, dots, or lines will not be read by the machine.

What happens if I accidentally put unnecessary marks on my ballot?

Any unnecessary marks made on the ballot, especially on the barcode, will make the ballot invalid. None of the votes will be read by the VCM.



PROHIBITED ACTS

- Any person who fails to cast his vote without justifiable excuse.
- Any person who votes more than once in the same election, or who, not being a registered voter, votes in an election.
- Any person who votes in substitution for another whether with or without the latter's knowledge and/or consent.
- Any person who, not being illiterate or physically disabled, allows his ballot to be prepared by another, or any person who prepares the ballot of another who is not illiterate or physically disabled, with or without the latter's knowledge and/or consent.
- Any person who avails himself of any means of scheme to discover the contents of the ballot of a voter who is preparing or casting his vote or who has just voted.
- Any voter who, in the course of voting, uses a ballot other than the one given by the board of election inspectors or has in his possession more than one official ballot.
- Any person who places under arrest or detains a voter without lawful cause, or molests him in such a manner as to obstruct or prevent him from going to the polling place to cast his vote or from returning home after casting his vote, or to compel him to reveal how he voted.
- Any member of a board of election inspectors who has made possible the casting of more votes than there are registered voters.



PROHIBITED ACTS

- Any person who, for the purpose of disrupting or obstructing the election process or causing confusion among the voters, propagates false and alarming reports or information or transmits or circulates false orders, directives or messages regarding any matter relating to the printing of official ballots, the postponement of the election, the transfer of polling place or the general conduct of the election.
- Any person who, without legal authority, destroys, substitutes or takes away from the possession of those having legal custody thereof, or from the place where they are legally deposited, any election form or document or ballot box which contains official ballots or other documents used in the election.
- Any person having legal custody of the ballot box containing the official ballots used in the election who opens or destroys said box or removes or destroys its contents without or against the order of the Commission or who, through his negligence, enables any person to commit any of the aforementioned acts, or takes away said ballot box from his custody.
- Any member of the board of election inspectors who knowingly uses ballots other than the official ballots, except in those cases where the use of emergency ballots is authorized.
- Any public official who neglects or fails to properly preserve or account for any ballot box, documents and forms received by him and kept under his custody.
- Any person who reveals the contents of the ballot of an illiterate or disabled voter whom he assisted in preparing a ballot.



PROHIBITED ACTS

- Any person who, without authority, transfers the location of a polling place.
- Any person who, without authority, prints or causes the printing of any ballot or election returns that appears as official ballots or election returns or who distributes or causes the same to be distributed for use in the election, whether or not they are actually used.
- Any person who, without authority, keeps, uses or carries out or causes to be kept, used or carried out, any official ballot or election returns or printed proof thereof, type-form mould, electro-type printing plates and any other plate, numbering machines and other printing paraphernalia being used in connection with the printing of official ballots or election returns.
- Any official or employee of any printing establishment or of the Commission or any member of the committee in charge of the printing of official ballots or election returns who causes official ballots or election returns to be printed in quantities exceeding those authorized by the Commission or who distributes, delivers, or in any manner disposes of or causes to be distributed, delivered, or disposed of, any official ballot or election returns to any person or persons not authorized by law or by the Commission to receive or keep official ballots or election returns or who sends or causes them to be sent to any place not designated by law or by the Commission.
- Any person who, through any act, means or device, violates the integrity of any official ballot or election returns before or after they are used in the election.



PROHIBITED ACTS

- Any person who removes, tears, defaces or destroys any certified list of candidates posted inside the voting booths during the hours of voting.
- Any person who holds or causes the holding of an election on any other day than that fixed by law or by the Commission, or stops any election being legally held.
- Any person who deliberately blurs his fingerprint in the voting record.



COVID-19 GUIDELINES

VOTERS INFORMATION FLYER

This year's 2022 national elections, the electoral board, volunteers, and individuals within the vicinities of the precincts and voting centers shall abide by the implemented health and safety protocols of the COMELEC in accordance with our present public health concern.

1

Before arriving at the voting premises, kindly secure facemasks, alcohol-based hand sanitizers, and other protective hygiene equipment that is available.

2

Voters must have their temperature checked with the available thermometer devices before entering the voting premises.

3

Upon entering the vicinity, maintain safe distancing of at least 1 meter apart with another individual.

4

Voters will now proceed to the Voters' Assistance Desk (VAD) to secure their precinct and sequence numbers and assigned room or clustered precinct.

5

After the VAD, voters can now go to their assigned room. They must state their name, precinct, and sequence numbers to the Electoral Board.



COVID-19 GUIDELINES

Voters will be given their ballot, ballot secrecy folder, and marking pen.

7

After receiving the said items, voters can proceed to the voting area where they can fill out the ballot by fully shading the oval appearing before the name of the candidate they wish to vote for.

8

After accomplishing the ballot, the voters will be asked to feed the ballot into the Vote Counting Machine (VCM).

9

Voters may check their voter's receipt and then deposit it in the receptacle.

10

Once done, the right forefinger nail of the voters will be stained with indelible ink.

11

Lastly, voters are advised to wash or disinfect their hands after the voting process for safety and health purposes.
