**Discernment requires voters to consider the moral implications of policies and candidates.**

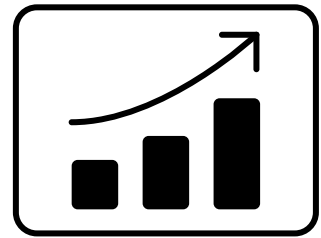


**Faith-based discernment goes beyond political party affiliation; it focuses on values, human dignity, and justice.**

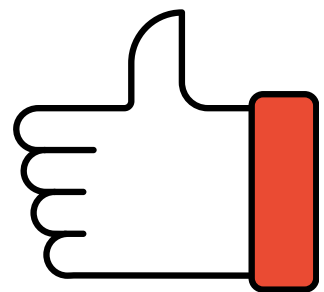


**Voters should prioritize leaders who advocate for systemic change that aligns with principles of fairness, equality, and justice.**
